#### GIFT AUGMENTS BETHEL SEMINARY'S SPIRITUALITY COLLECTION

Bethel Theological Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, has recently received approximately 1800 volumes in the literature of spirituality/life of devotion from the private collection of their late President Emeritus Carl H. Lundquist. These volumes will be housed with the special Nelson collection in the literature of spirituality, which President Lundquist was instrumental in acquiring about a decade ago. The Lundquist/Nelson Library of Devotional Literature, which totals more than 3,000 volumes, is supplemented by about 2,000 volumes in the regular collection. The books of the Lundquist/Nelson Library have all been added to the automated data base of the holdings of the libraries of the Minnesota Theological Library Association. Norris A. Magnuson is Director of the Bethel Seminary Library.

#### PROFESSOR WILFRED C. SMITH MAKES INTERESTING OFFER

#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

As spring rushes headlong toward summer here in Evanston, we're looking forward to the ocean breezes of Vancouver. The forty-seventh ATLA Annual Conference will meet June 16-19, co-hosted by the Vancouver School of Theology and the Regent/Carey Library. By the time you read this, many of you will have registered and made travel plans. The staff at the host libraries, the Annual Conference Committee and the Education Committee have worked hard to plan an informative and exciting program, from the pre-conference seminars to the closing banquet.

Thank you to everyone who cast their ballots in the 1993 Board of Directors election. The number of ballots received exceeded last year's return by 33%! The Tellers Committee has convened, and new Board members will be introduced at the Annual Conference.

The ATLA Education Committee has awarded three grants for regional continuing education programs in 1993. The following have received grants for one-day events: Southeastern Pennsylvania Library Association (SEPTLA), on the cataloging of audiovisual materials; the St. Louis Theological Consortium, on CD-ROM decision making; and a conference of ATLA libraries in the Southeastern United States, to plan and organize a regional theological library consortium. These events advance the mission of ATLA in fostering professional growth and stimulating collaboration among theological librarians. Education Committee grants will be available in 1994 as well; the Committee will announce application procedures and requirements.

Beginning with the next issue of the ATLA Newsletter (vol. 41, no. 1), the office of the Executive Secretary will have the honor of succeeding Donn Michael Farris in the editing and production of this publication. Mr. Farris has provided an invaluable service to ATLA, keeping members and subscribers well-informed of news and events in theological librarianship for the past forty years. The office of the Executive Secretary intends to maintain the high standards upheld by Mr. Farris for the ATLA Newsletter. Of course, we also will continue to depend upon members and friends for announcements and new items! #### DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AT HOME AND ABROAD

Since ATLA mailed its 1993 Opportunity Giving brochure just over a month ago, it has received to date \$1,270 from fifteen contributors. Most donors designated their gifts for member services, which this year will, among other things, support regional and national professional education events, provide registration subsidies for members attending their first ATLA Annual Conference, and encourage theological librarians in developing countries to participate in ATLA. Some donors also designated their contributions for the Index or Preservation Programs or for the Endowment Fund. Executive Secretary Joanne Juhnke reports that as a result of the subsidized conference registration fee offer, six new members recently joined ATLA and will be at the conference in Vancouver. There is still time until the end of the ATLA fiscal year on August 31 to make your 1993 Opportunity Giving contribution and support these significant new initiatives.

As part of ATLA's strategy to develop global partnerships, I visited seven theological libraries and three university libraries in Puerto Rico, Costa Rica, and Jamaica between March 7 and March 21. The institutions visited in Puerto Rico were: The Evangelical Seminary of Puerto Rico, the Dominican Seminary at Bayamon, Colegico Biblico Pentecostal, Mispa Seminary, Alliance Theological Seminary, and the University of Puerto Rico, including its Library School; in Costa Rica, the Biblical Seminary of Latin America, the Department of Ecumenical Investigations, Central (Catholic) Seminary, and the University of Costa Rica; in Jamaica, the United Theological College of the West Indies and the University of the West Indies, including its Library School. Unfortunately, when in Jamaica I was unable to call on ATLA member Tim Erdel at the Jamaica Theological Seminary/Caribbean Graduate School of Theology as he was out of the country attending a conference at the time of my visit. However, while in Costa Rica I did have opportunity to confer with theological librarians from Nicaragua and Venezuela, who traveled there specifically to discuss their libraries and learn how ATLA might be of assistance to them.

In all of these places I was impressed with the professional competence, sound training, and strong commitment of our colleagues serving in librarian-ship in the Caribbean and in Central America. While often working under severe handicaps of limited budgets, insufficient staff, and inadequate space, they render outstanding service to their students and faculties, their churches and societies.

One of their greatest handicaps is their isolation from the library world due to their lack of automated library systems and access to bibliographic networks. Thus, although using computers for word processing, without these more sophisticated technological resources, each library is forced to do time-consuming and costly original cataloging for all of its acquisitions. ATLA is now investigating with several of these theological institutions and with an interested U.S. foundation the appropriate computer programs and hardware for their establishing local area networks and for ATLA delivering an extensive data base of theological records online or by CD-ROM.

#### CONFERENCE HELD ON THE FORMATION OF "SEATLA"

A conference on the formation of a Southeastern area association of theological libraries was held on May 1, 1993, at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. It was sponsored by the libraries of Candler School of Theology, Columbia Theological Seminary, Duke Divinity School, and Vanderbilt Divinity School. Those in attendance included David Chen, James Dunkly, Lynn Feider, Patrick Graham, William Hook, Nancy Hendrix, Ruthanne Huff, Channing Jeschke, Roger Loyd, Cindy Runyon, Roberta Schaafsma, Marcia Watt, and Christine Wenderoth.

The meeting began with an address by Jim Dunkly on the future of regional theological library cooperation and was followed by discussion. During lunch Marcia Watt, Head of Preservation for Emory University libraries, discussed the possibilities of Southeastern theological libraries collaborating in preservation projects. The afternoon portion of the conference was devoted to a panel discussion, whose participants reflected on their respective experiences in regional theological library associations: James Dunkly on BTI (Boston Theological Institute) and CATLA (Chicago Area Theological Library Association, William Hook on TTLA (Tennessee Theological Library Association), Roger Loyd on SWATLA (Southwestern Area Theological Library Association), and Christine Wenderoth on ATA (Atlanta Theological Association). In this discussion the participants outlined the organizational structure and work of their respective groups and reflected on the possibilities of forming a Southeastern organization of ATLA libraries. Discussion followed.

While there were reservations expressed about the wisdom of forming yet another library organization with its attendant meeting schedule, the group agreed that there was justification for a Southeastern association of ATLA libraries that could address such matters as cooperative collection development, preservation of library materials, resource sharing, electronic connectivity, etc. The meeting concluded with a decision to invite ATLA-member libraries in seven states of the Southeast (Florida, Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee) to meet at the ATLA Annual Conference in Vancouver, for the purpose of discussing further the feasibility of organizing a regional association of theological libraries.

## REPORT FROM THE TECHNICAL SERVICES SECTION

Subject Headings, Theological—Workshops—Vancouver. This summer at the ATLA conference in Vancouver, theological catalogers will have a chance to talk with representatives from the Library of Congress about subject headings and the perennial problems they present. Mr. Thompson A. Yee, of the Religion, Psychology, and Philosophy Team at LC, and Mr. Warren Kissinger, Senior Cataloger at LC, will present an all-day workshop on Wednesday, June 16, on "Theological Subject Headings." This is not another "Introduction to Subject Headings"; familiarity with the rules for assigning LC subject headings and subdivisions is assumed. Topics to be covered include the guidelines for subject heading assignment, particularly for theological materials; use of LC's Subject Cataloging Manual: Subject Headings; assignment of subdivisions; how to submit suggestions for new headings; and anticipated developments in subject cataloging.

Participants are strongly encouraged to submit questions about subject access (including LC classification schedules) ahead of time. Some issues that concern catalogers include: the use of the term "Sects" for Protestant denominations; when to use the name of a specific denomination ("United Methodist Church, U.S."), and when to use a generic name ("Methodist Church"); the use of the subdivision "Religious aspects"; and, What has puzzled you in the course of cataloging? How (NOT) to Have a Library Disaster. The chances are very good that each of us will experience at least one major library disaster in the course of our careers. On Wednesday, June 16, Randy Silverman will be presenting an all-day workshop on "Preventive Conservation and Disaster Recovery." Mr. Silverman is currently the Preservation Librarian at Brigham Young University, and is experienced both as a disaster consultant and a workshop leader. The first part of the workshop will focus on preventing disasters: how to identify areas of our collections and facilities that are at risk and determine preventative measures that can be taken. In the afternoon, participants will consider what they need to have in place to make as complete and timely a recovery as possible. The appropriate procedures for recovering wet books, documents, and photographs will be demonstrated using slides, video tapes, and hands-on demonstrations.

The object of this workshop is to enable participants to assemble disaster prevention and planning materials for their own institutions. Participants will each be given a notebook for recording the names and telephone numbers of people to be contacted in the event of a library disaster. Technical Services Pre-Conference in Vancouver. Even though it is not listed in the Vancouver ATLA program, the Technical Services Section will be

holding a special preconference session. (The location will be announced in the registration material.) This will give anyone who works in cataloging, acquisitions, preservation, serials, etc. a chance to talk with peers from other institutions about issues of common concern. We have set aside from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday - the evening before the continuing education workshops. This year we will break into groups based on library function (acquisitons, cataloging, authority work, library systems, etc.). There is no charge for this meeting.

The Technical Services Section Steering Committee will also be meeting on Tuesday afternoon at about 4:30 p.m., at a location yet to be determined.

Looking at the OPAC from Both Sides: Public and Technical Services in Friendly Dialogue. Two of the great ironies of library access are that those who interpret library catalogs have so little input concerning the data to which they are providing access; and conversely, that those who create library catalogs often have so little awareness of the actual needs of the users whom they serve. The advent of computerized library systems, however, provides opportunity for the long overdue interaction between reference librarians and catalogers. That is what this workshop session at the Vancouver ATLA conference is about.

On Saturday morning, June 19, from 9:00 to 11:45 a.m., a panel of two technical services and two public services librarians will "have at it" on such issues as OPAC features to look for when evaluating systems; feasibility of including table of contents or annotations into bibliographic records; keyword versus "subject heading" searches; assessing studies of catalog use patterns; use of locally defined subject headings, and so forth. Hopefully, the users will be the ones to benefit from increased cooperation within our libraries, and this program, jointly sponsored by the Technical Services and Public Services Interest Groups, will help us work more effectively together. Be sure to mark it on your ATLA conference schedule!

#### CONCORDIA SEMINARY CATALOG AVAILABLE ON CD-ROM

The Concordia Seminary Library CD-ROM catalog (Brodart LePac), newly remastered and containing nearly 150,000 records, will be available in October 1993. Strengths of the collection include Reformation and church history, Biblical studies, and Lutheran doctrine, liturgics, and hymnody. A rare book collection of several thousand items and a growing list of Reformation era publications on microfiche make the database especially valuable for theological scholarly research and for copy cataloging. ## PRESERVATION GRANT AWARDED TO PITTS THEOLOGY LIBRARY

The Pitts Theology Library at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, recently was awarded \$33,070 for the microfilming of 1,000 embrittled theological dissertations and lectures from northern Europe. These works were issued between 1830 and 1931 and will be filmed over a two-year period. The effort is funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities and is part of the Research Library Group's Great Collections Microfilming Project, Phase 4. The other institutions providing materials for filming are Brown, Cleveland Public Library, Columbia, Cornell, New York Public Library, New York University, Stanford, University of California at Berkeley, University of Chicago, University of Florida, University of Southern California, Yale Divinity Library, Yeshiva University, and YIVO Institute for Jewish Research.

## HISTORY OF PERKINS SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY PUBLISHED

A long-awaited history of the Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas, is now available. Written by long-time faculty member Lewis Howard Grimes (1915-1989), the 278-page volume was revised, completed and edited after the author's death by Roger L. Loyd, formerly of the Bridwell Library staff at SMU and now Director of the Duke Divinity School Library in Durham, North Carolina. Entitled A History of the Perkins School of Theology, the volume was published by Southern Methodist University Press in early 1993 (ISBD: 0870743465; LCCN: 92-39891). The volume includes an index and bibliography, and a small section of photographs. The retail price is \$24.95. Along with narratives of theological controversies, faculty contributions, and significant benefactions by the Perkins and Bridwell families and others, the work provides substantial information on the history of the theological library collections at Southern Methodist University.

## INFORMATION SOUGHT ON AFRICAN LANGUAGES HOLDINGS

The Cataloging Committee of the African Studies Association Africana Librarians Council is distributing a short survey of the African languages holdings of Africana collections. This survey will be used to create a location and finding guide for African languages materials, which could greatly assist researchers. We have distributed the survey to our membership, and we hope to broaden the scope of the survey to other institutions. ## SIX THEOLOGICAL LIBRARIES ARE MEMBERS OF A NEW NETWORK

The nation's first statewide, automated private academic library resource-sharing network will be established in Indiana with a \$4.8 million grant from the Lilly Endowment, Inc. Six theological institutions are members of the Private Academic Library Network of Indiana (PALNI). A total of 24 private academic libraries are in the group which will be mounting a shared database of 4.4 million records in Indianapolis.

The theological participants are: The Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminaries, Christian Theological Seminary, Concordia Theological Seminary (Fort Wayne), Grace Theological Seminary, and Earlham School of Religion. The library of Anderson University (School of Theology) maintains its own local system and will tape-load records into the shared database.

The PALNI network will provide access for the cooperating libraries' patrons to all the institutions' library holdings as well as ultimately to those of Indiana's state-supported institutions and the University of Notre Dame. The shared database and bibliographic data-handling capabilities of the system will allow participating libraries to engage in increasingly sophisticated resource sharing and cooperative acquisitions programs.

A contract was signed with Data Research Associates in early May 1993. Implementation will begin this summer at Indianapolis-area libraries, including Christian Theological Seminary. Other member libraries will come online during the year according to a prescribed timetable. The grant includes partial support of the annual maintenance costs for the first three years.

## A CHECKLIST OF REFERENCE TOOLS OF INTEREST TO THEOLOGICAL LIBRARIANS, 1991-1992

This bibliography is the ninth annual supplement to the "Checklist" which appeared in the February 18, 1984 issue of the ATLA Newsletter. #### STITT LIBRARY RECEIVES \$50,000 GRANT FOR ARCHIVES PROJECT

The David and Jane Stitt Library of the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Austin, Texas, has been awarded \$50,000 by the Presbyterian Historical Society of the Southwest for the support of the joint archives project of the McCoy Historical Center and the Stitt Library. The funds represent a significant portion of the overall fund-raising goal of \$450,000 to renovate the archival area and establish a regional archives and resource center for the study of the Presbyterian and Reformed tradition in the southwest. This grant will be used to finance a one-year archivist's position and the purchase of archival supplies. During this year, the current holdings will be organized and entered into the library's automated catalog in machine-readable format.

The project not only will make the current collection more accessible to researchers, it will facilitate the attempt to complete the library's holdings of the official records of churches, presbyteries, and synods in the southwest by encouraging area churches and institutions to preserve and microfilm their records, placing copies with the national Presbyterian archives and the Stitt Library regional archival research center. The Presbyterian Historical Society of the Southwest and the Bicentennial Fund of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) have also made a gift of \$10,000 for the retrospective conversion of the microform holdings of the McCoy Center and the Stitt Library. Dr. Valerie R. Hotchkiss is Director of the Stitt Library.

R. Grant Bracewell will retire at the end of June as Librarian of Emmanuel College, Victoria University, in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, a position he has held for the past twenty-five years. During this time he has been active in college, campus, professional, and church committees and boards. A member of the ATLA since 1968, he served the Association as a member of the Index Board for 12 years, first as Secretary and then as Chairperson. During his terms the Index developed from a manually produced volume to a service supported by a machine readable database and appeared under new names, RIO, RIT, and Research in Ministry. He was a member of the Joint Task Force on Strategy for Seminary Libraries and Learning Material Centres for the 70s; was Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Implementation of the Task Force Report and headed the Committee on American Theological Library Needs. In addition to his Victoria University position, he was cross appointed as Toronto School of Theology Library Coordinator and was Book Selector for Theology, in the Collection Development Department of the University of Toronto Library. During his association with the collection development work at the UTL and the seven TST libraries, these libraries came to provide collectively one of the outstanding theological collections in North America. He was one of the instigators for the development of the machine readable Campus Union Catalog which forms a part of the University of Toronto Public Access Catalog. All seven of the TST libraries are included in the UTLCat. Mr. Bracewell is a minister of The United Church of Canada and has served in presbytery, conference, and General Council committees and offices, including being the first chairperson of a newly established presbytery. He and his wife, Eleanor, are planning to move to the west coast (south of Vancouver) when they retire.

Steven R. Brandt, Director of the Hiebert Library which serves Fresno Pacific College and the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary in Fresno, California, was awarded the Ph.D. degree by the University of California in Berkeley in December 1992. His dissertation is entitled "Jean Girard: Genevan Publisher, 1536-1557."

Mary Anne Culbertson has been appointed Director of the John Bulow Campbell Library at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. She is currently Director of the Birchard Public Library in Fremont, Ohio. Ms. Culbertson holds the A.B. degree from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan, and the M.S.L.S. degree from the University of Southern California in Los Angeles. She will assume her new position during the coming summer.

James T. Dennison, Jr., Librarian and Lecturer in Church History at Westminster Theological Seminary in California, Escondido, has released the first volume of his edition of George Musgrave Giger's translation of Francis Turretin's <u>Institutes of Elenctic Theology</u> (Phillipsburg, NJ: Presbyterian and Reformed Publishing Co. ISBN 0-87552-451-6 (v. 1)). Turretin (1623-1687) was a prominent Calvinistic Scholastic who taught in Geneva, Switzerland. His <u>Institutio</u> was influential in Scottish and American circles into the 19th

century. Charles Hodge used it as a textbook at Princeton Seminary, as did Robert Dabney at Union Theological Seminary in Virginia. Dennison has edited Giger's translation of the 1847-48 Edinburgh/New York edition in the interest of better readability. He has also added bibliographical citations for Turretin's numerous quotations from the church fathers, medieval, Reformation, and 17th century authors. Two additional volumes will complete the set. Volume three will contain indexes as well as an historical essay on the life and influence of Turretin.

M. Patrick Graham has been named Director of the Pitts Theology Library of the Candler School of Theology at Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia, his appointment to become effective on September 1, 1994 following the retirement of Dr. Channing R. Jeschke from that position. Dr. Graham is currently Reference Librarian of the Pitts Library.

Darryl G. Hart has been appointed Librarian of Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and will take up his new duties in August of this year. Dr. Hart is currently Director of the Institute for the Study of American Evangelicals at Wheaton College in Wheaton, Illinois.

#### YALE DIVINITY SCHOOL LIBRARY AWARDED PRESERVATION GRANT

Yale Divinity School Library in New Haven, Connecticut, has been awarded a grant of \$185,400 to preserve 3,000 serials volumes from its Day Missions Collection over a two-year period. This project is funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities through Great Collections Microfilming Project, Phase IV (GCMP IV) of the Research Libraries Group (RLG). This grant continues a ten-year effort by RLG institutions to save disintegrating materials in the nation's libraries.

The Day Missions Collection is named for George Edward Day, a professor of Hebrew language and literature at Yale, who donated his collection of materials documenting the history of Christian mission to Yale in 1892. This library became one of three collections brought together to form the Yale Divinity School Library in 1932. This collection is generally considered to be the most extensive of its kind. While its focus is the history of Christian missions, this collection is of vital importance for understanding the impact of Western culture on the non-Western world, and it provides primary documentation of the cultures to which the missionaries went.

GCMP IV will extend over two years, March 1993 through February 1995, and will result in the filming of 22,636 volumes from the collections of 15 RLG member institutions. All together NEH has approved \$1,919,984 for GCMP IV. The collections were chosen because of their overall significance to humanities research. Catalog records for works microfilmed during this phase will be loaded into RLIN (Research Libraries Information Network) as were catalog records for the first three phases.

The first Great Collections Microfilming Project began in October 1988; by the end of GCMP IV, 22 institutions will have filmed nearly 94,000 volumes. To date, more than 146,000 volumes and 25 manuscript collections (about 1,000 linear feet) have been preserved on microfilm as the result of RLG's many cooperative preservation projects. Through involvement in these projects, participants have been able to establish successful preservation microfilming operations at their institutions.

#### ATLA EDUCATION COMMITTEE MAKES GRANT AWARDS

Three ATLA member Libraries/Consortia have been awarded grant monies to support regional educational events in 1993. The Southeastern Pennsylvania Theological Library Association (SEPTLA) received \$500.00 for a one day, hands-on conference on the cataloging of all types of audiovisual materials. The St. Louis Theological Consortium was awarded \$250.00 for a workshop entitled "CD-ROM Decision-Making." The workshop will focus on the varieties of CD-ROM hardware and software which are available, the ways they might be networked, and the future of CD-ROM technology. Four ATLA libraries in the southeast, those of Candler School of Theology, Columbia Theological Seminary, Duke Divinity School, and Vanderbilt Divinity School, were granted \$500.00 for a one-day conference to consider the future of regional theological library cooperation in general, and to plan for the establishment of a regional theological library consortium in the southeast.

During the forty years I have edited the <u>Newsletter</u> I have taken advantage of personal privilege on only three previous occasions: when I announced my marriage to Joyce Gwendolyn Lockhart in 1956, when I reported the birth of our son Evan Michael in 1960, and when I announced the birth of our daughter Amy Virginia in 1962. I now claim this right again for the fourth and last time to say goodbye to this publication and its readers.

If someone had told me in the spring of 1953 when I volunteered to establish and edit the Newsletter that I would not relinquish that responsibility until the spring of 1993, I would have rolled my eyes heavenward and suggested that that person seek professional help as soon as possible. I found that I liked the job and that I liked it more and more as the Association grew in strength, in the variety of its activities, and in its significance in the areas of both bibliography and theological education. founding of the Newsletter grew out of the realization that the Association - consisting then of a very small number of librarians scattered over the whole of the United States and Canada - needed some mechanism to provide communication of news between our annual conferences and, it was hoped, to enhance our sense of community and common purpose. I believe that the Newsletter served these purposes well, particularly during those early and precarious years of our history. How well and in what ways it has served as the ATLA has grown and matured I will let be judged by others who may perhaps bring to the question greater objectivity than is given to me.

This is the 154th issue of the Newsletter which I have edited (the first six volumes contained only three numbers each before we moved to fournumber volumes with volume 7). As I indicated in my initial paragraph, my involvement with the Newsletter is older than my children and older than my marriage. Thus it has been integrally a part of our family life from the beginning of that life. Joyce and I even set our wedding date to allow us to get the November 1956 issue into the mail before we left for our honeymoon. And, subsequently, vacations, travel, and special family events have always been planned with at least one eye on the publication schedule of the These kinds of memories will, I expect, make it as difficult to sever my tie with the Newsletter as it was to lock my office door at Duke for the final time last summer after forty-two years there. I rather expect that I may well feel my separation from this publication most acutely three months from now when I am sitting at my writing desk on Topsail Island (just off the southeastern coast of North Carolina), where I have prepared the August issue for the past twenty years or more. I fully expect to find myself looking out over the South Atlantic and wondering what I am supposed to do with the pen in my hand. Yes, over all these years the whole thing has been done in longhand before being turned into typescript. You are losing an editor out of the nineteenth century before you have to move into the twenty-first century.

What I most wish to do in this final piece, though, is to express my gratitude to many people - most of whom will go unnamed - who have assisted me in this journalistic venture over the years. First of all, I wish to thank the long succession of officers and directors of the Association who have supported, continued to concur in my appointment to the editorship,

and given me a remarkable freedom to determine the nature and content of the Newsletter according to my own best judgment - without imposing prior restrictions or indulging in subsequent criticism or recrimination. I know that no other member of this large group of colleagues will fail to understand my wish to mention one of them by name - Bob Olsen, who served as Treasurer of the ATLA for almost half the time I served as Editor of the Newsletter. His cooperation and counsel in all matters concerning the finances of the Newsletter never failed and his personal support of Joyce and me was unmatched.

I want to recognize and thank the thirty or so full-time staff members who passed through the Divinity School Library during the forty years of my editorship. Accepting the leadership and example of Harriet Leonard, the most prominent and permanent member of this group, they listened four times each year as she put out the word: "It's Newsletter time again," and for the week or ten days that it took me to put together the next issue, all of them approached me with a softer step, spoke to me in a gentler tone, and sought to lay no new problems of the library upon me. I can never repay my debt to these loyal and caring people - and especially Harriet.

For more of the middle and later years of my editorship of the Newsletter than I can calculate, it was printed by Robert Raper in his capacity as a member of the staff of the Photographic Services Department of the Duke University Library and later as an independent commercial printer. Bob gave his devoted service to me and to the Newsletter for as long as he was able. He went far beyond the call of duty and far beyond the amounts for which he billed the Association in the support and assistance which he gave to me; and I want him to know that I am grateful to him.

The final seventeen issues of the <u>Newsletter</u> produced under my editorship have been printed by Glenda LaCoste, the current Head of the Photographic Services Department of the University Library. She has provided us with a quality of product and a speed and dependability of service which could not have been improved upon. She has been sensitive to the fact that she was working with Joyce and me during the period when both of us were facing the trauma of our impending retirements from our long careers at Duke — and during a time when both of us had to face serious health crises. The grace and understanding which have always accompanied her production of the finished <u>Newsletters</u> over these past four years have been memorable and moving. And we shall never cease being thankful for the many levels of support which she offered during the final <u>Newsletter</u> years.

Probably no phrase is more often used to pay tribute to a wife than, "I could never have done it without her." There is, however, no instance in the history of Western culture when the phrase has had more weight of meaning than when the Editor of the Newsletter says, "I could never have done this without Joyce." Her name should indeed have been on the masthead of every issue as "Associate Editor."

To begin with, I would never have taken the post as Editor had I not known that I had her talents to assist me. At the time I agreed to establish the Newsletter, she had already been the other half of the Duke Divinity School Library staff for three years, so I knew her typing skill well.

I also knew that whatever I had to offer the publication, it would count for little without someone who could produce finished typed pages that were neat, accurate, and pleasing to the eye. I still believe I was correct in this judgment and that much of whatever success the Newsletter has enjoyed is the result of its orderly, uncluttered, and pleasant appearance. In the ensuing forty years Joyce has typed every one of the more than 3,300 pages of the Newsletter - plus the hundreds of pages of correspondence which its publication has entailed - and for the first thirty years every one of the address labels for the mailing of the announcement post cards and the Newsletters themselves.

As important as anything I have already mentioned, Joyce has watched over my spelling, punctuation, grammar, syntax, and style. She has never hesitated to tell me when I ran afoul of the rules and has thus saved me and the Newsletter more embarrassments than I can possibly know. For each of these corrective acts I am grateful.

And finally, I want to acknowledge all of the moral support, encouragement, reassurance, and strength of spirit she has provided me in this journalistic venture, as in all the other aspects of my life, over these many years. It is not given to many men to have a good wife, best friend, respected professional colleague, and most conscientious yet gentle criticall wrapped in the same neat package, and I am happy to testify to my good fortune. Nor is it given to many men to have the opportunity to give this testimony in the public print, so I decline to forego it.

In closing these remarks about Joyce, I choose to remind her colleagues that while making these contributions to the Association she was raising two great children to maturity, making her best effort to do the same for the Editor, running a household, coping with several serious illnesses, surviving four major surgeries, holding a full-time position outside the home first as a medical secretary and then as a professional librarian and administrator, and during five of these years working toward the completion of her M.S. in L.S. degree at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Yet she never missed a heart-beat of the Newsletter. I have with deliberate forethought given over much of my final piece for the Newsletter to Joyce. Although I think she knows the depth of my gratitude for her contribution, I want to be sure that the members of this Association know that; and I want anyone who has ever read the Newsletter with appreciation to know how much of that response ought to be directed to her.

Goodbye. I shall sorely miss the ATLA. Working with it and the host of friends it has brought me has been the single most satisfying and rewarding aspect of my entire professional life. As the Association nears the end of its first half-century, I think it faces the era of its greatest challenge and its greatest promise. To the ATLA Newsletter - I shall watch your future with concern, love, and hope. May you have a long and useful life.
